

WORDS OUTDOORS

Literacy - Key Stage 2

Resources: natural objects around the playground, worksheet or whiteboard, pen and chalk.

Pupils collect natural materials then write examples of adjectives, which may also be alliterative, for their objects.

They can then have fun thinking of collective nouns for their objects.

Finally they can make a sentence using collective noun-adjective-noun.

NOUNS

Give the children 5 minutes to write the name of at least five different object which catch their eye around the playground.

Come back to the circle and each child reads out something different that they found. If anyone has not seen 10 different natural objects then they add it to their table.

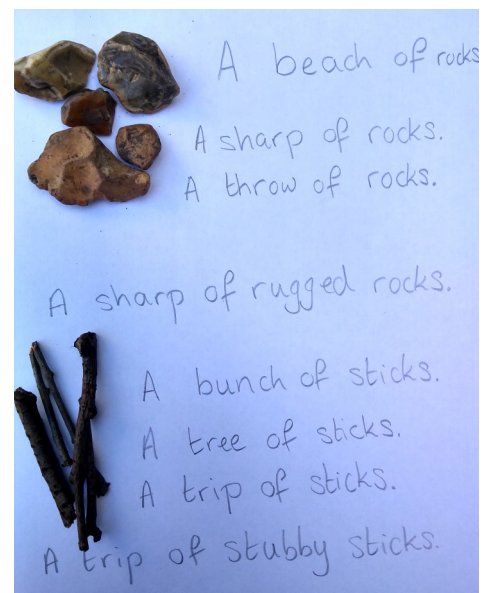
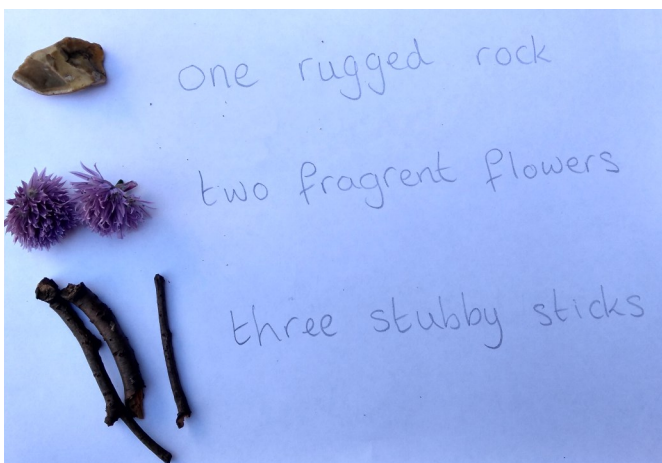
ADJECTIVE AND NOUN

Send the children back to their object and ask them to write an adjective for each (you could ask them to make them alliterative if you wish).

Get the group to share their ideas.

COLLECTIVE NOUNS

Finally have fun making up collective nouns for groups of objects, then put these into sentences along with the alliterative adjectives.
