Learning Objectives

- To develop enjoyment of reading
- To consider the characteristics of a story, recognising and joining in with predictable phrases
- To describe and talk about their environment, including features they like and dislike

Some suggestions for visit preparation

- 1. Read 'The Gruffalo' by Julia Donaldson and encourage children's familiarity through chants.
- 2. Make a Gruffalo mask.

Suggested follow-on activities

- 1. Make storyboards.
- 2. Make a profile of their favourite character.
- 3. Write their own Gruffalo adventure.

- continuing to build up a repertoire of poems learnt by heart, appreciating these and reciting some, with appropriate intonation to make the meaning clear
- answering and asking questions
- predicting what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far
